



Maintenance

In the first ninety days of a mattress's life, it must be turned (head to foot and top to bottom) at least twice a month to allow it to settle correctly. Mattresses with removable covers are very convenient in terms of hygiene and functionality: the cover can easily be removed and washed (machine or dry-cleaned, depending on the materials and size).

Mattresses must be placed on good quality bases, which must never be smaller than the mattress itself. An excellent mattress on a mediocre or unsuitable base will soon be ruined for good. The base must be coordinated with the mattress and vice versa. This is because the base not only provides support, it also allows for ventilation.

Children must not be allowed to jump on mattresses, as this may damage the inner layers of the mattress. Dust should be removed using low suction vacuum cleaners, rather than beaters (too violent). Mattresses must never be soaked in water, nor steam cleaned: the inside layers would become humid, thus creating a friendly environment for dust mites, and possibly causing rotting. Regular maintenance must include exposure to air: leave the mattress uncovered and upturned.

Consult your dealer for problems with stains and do not try to remove them yourself. Mattresses must not be rolled up or folded: their inside layers would be damaged. For reasons of hygiene, mattresses should be replaced every 5-7 years.
